



- 1) The Scout Oath & Law govern our operation.
- 2) All current Youth Protection Guidelines and the Guide to Safe Scouting must be followed at all times.
- 3) Leave No Trace guidelines will be followed.
- 4) Please strive to leave the camp cleaner than you found it.
- 5) Reservations for all camping must be made in advance with the NWSC council office.
- 6) Check-in time is 6–9pm Friday evening. If you wish to arrive before or after this time, please call the Ranger so that we can arrange to have someone available to check you in.
- 7) Campmasters, when on duty, will be in charge of the camp and assist with programs on request, subject to camp rules and the authority of the Ranger.
- 8) The Unit leader must check-in with the Campmaster immediately upon arrival. Check-out must be done by the designated unit leader with the Campmaster. Failure to follow this procedure will cause the forfeiture of the deposit.
- 9) Camp Lakota Vehicle Policy
 - a) The camp speed limit is 10 MPH.
 - b) Cars and trailers will remain on the gravel roads AT ALL TIMES.
 - c) Vehicles are not to be used in camp, except to load and unload upon arrival and departure. Please unload and park your vehicle in your assigned spot quickly.
 - d) Cars needing to leave the camp during the day on Saturday must plan on parking in the main parking lot, as the gate may be locked.
- 10) Only campsites assigned by the Ranger or Campmaster will be used.
- 11) If you wish to undertake any camp improvement or service project during your stay, the project must be discussed with the Ranger before starting. All projects must be approved by the properties committee.
- 12) Camp-wide quiet hours are 11 PM to 7 AM.
- 13) Please cooperate with the leaders of other units using the camp. Keep your area supervised and clean. Follow the Campmaster's or Ranger's instructions and the check-out sheet carefully. You will be responsible for damages caused by your group.
- 14) Use bulletin boards to post items. DO NOT attach anything to the walls or ceiling.
- 15) Help conserve energy – keep the heat low and lights off when not in use. If the heat is on, keep windows and doors closed.
- 16) Equipment is available on a limited basis for use or rental. All equipment must be returned in acceptable condition before checking out. Arrangements for borrowing equipment must be made in advance to ensure availability.
- 17) Do not bring your own firewood. You may gather downed wood at camp or purchase wood locally. It is against the law to transport firewood between counties.
- 18) No live trees or brush may be cut without express approval of the Ranger.
- 19) Use only existing fire rings; do not start new ones.
 - a) All fires must be attended at all times, be appropriately sized for use, and when unit retires for the night or leaves the campsite, all fires must be completely extinguished.
 - b) The use of any liquid fuel for starting any type of fire is prohibited; this includes wood or charcoal cooking fires and ceremonial campfires.
- 20) Group or ceremonial campfires will be held only in areas approved by the Ranger. An adequate source of water must be available before lighting any fire.
- 21) Carving or otherwise defacing of any Scout property, including trees, will be charged to the unit. Be certain to check your area upon arrival and report any prior damage to the Campmaster or Ranger.
- 22) To prevent drinking water from being contaminated, no washing of any kind is permitted at pumps or water taps.
- 23) Fences are not to be cut or climbed upon. Any broken fence or poles should be reported to the Ranger
- 24) The following are strictly prohibited at camp:
 - a) Personal firearms, bows, and arrows
 - b) Alcoholic beverages (including beer)
 - c) Non-medicinal drugs
 - d) Fireworks
 - e) Pets
 - f) Power Tools (i.e. Chain Saws, etc.)
- 25) Please be sure your youth refrain from treating camp property carelessly. For example, they should not: climb on railings or the roof, climb trees, sit on tables, nor play on the table & chair racks.
- 26) IN CASE OF ACCIDENT OR EMERGENCY, notify Ranger or Campmaster. If emergency requires leaving camp, at least one adult leader must remain with the unit.
